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## Class I

This week Reception learnt a little bit about time. We learnt that the minute hand was longer and the hour hand was shorter. We then practised reading an analogue clock to the hour. The children then participated in a science experiment. We all made puddles on the yard and drew around them in chalk. We left them for a hour and went back outside to see what had happened...they had disappeared! We discussed that when the weather is hot the water will evaporate and go up into the clouds. The children also looked at the globe and learnt a little bit about the North Pole, South Pole and the equator and discussed what the weather would be like there. We even found out that polar bears live at the North Pole and penguins live at the South Pole!

<u>Class 2 & 3</u>

This week Year I and 2 have enjoyed packing a backpack with important items for Belle to take on her adventure in the book 'The Bee that Spoke'. The children have used adjectives and expanded noun phrases to describe each item and explain why it is important. In Science the children have discussed what a habitat is and the different types of habitats animals live in around the world. They have also investigated the different conditions needed to grow cress by undertaking an experiment in small groups. The children are enjoying tri-golf sessions on a Thursday afternoon and are learning to hit the ball with greater accuracy. A very busy but fun week! Well done everyone.

# <u>Class 5 & 6</u>

This week the children have completed reading 'Pebble in my Pocket' and have learnt a great deal about the history of the earth. They have also enriched their vocabularies by studying words like: erode, collide, disintegrate, glacier and crevasse. In maths we have completed our study of area and perimeter and will be moving on to time next week. Please encourage your child to tell the time using both analogue and digital clocks. In science we have started to study sound and investigate how sounds are made. In history we have been looking at place names and finding out what they tell us about Anglo-Saxon settlements. Inspired by our book, 'Pebble in my Pocket', the children created some amazing pictures of volcanoes using oil pastels.
