


# Class 4 and 5

Year 4 are really enjoying reading 'The Bluest of Blues' which is all about a Victorian female botanist. Last week we invented our own sea creature and then described it. We also had a go at writing a job application letter and the results were amazing! In maths we have started investigating fractions of shapes and unit and non-unit fractions. In history we imagined that we were chimney sweeps and wrote a letter describing our experiences. In computing we have started to do some simple programming using 'Scratch' a child friendly programming language. In R.E. we have looked at the wide variety of Hindu Gods. In art we have completed our botanical themed paintings.

Year 3 have been using dictionaries to find the definitions of tricky, new words. We have also created our very own

sea creature based on the book The Bluest of Blues and added a description pretending that we had just found the creature at the beach. In R.E we have created some amazing posters of Muslim festivals. In history, we have found out about the young coal miners from the Victorian era. In science we have started finding out about electricity and circuits. We each looked at what made successful circuit.



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
