


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Class I






Class 2 & 3

This week year I and 2 have had another visit from 'The Union Chain Bridge Project'. This week the children were Botanists. They studied the plants and painted them using water colour paints. The children enjoyed a music lesson and performing a song to reception.







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Class 4

This week in literacy we have been delving deeper into our new book 'How to be a Lion'. We have been analysing the illustrations on the first pages and explaining how we feel. We have also been making predictions about what we think will happen next in the story. In numeracy, we have been reinforcing our place value knowledge. In P.E we are developing our confidence with ball skills and we have started to introduce competitive games. In science, we have created our very own healthy eating plate categorising the foods into carbohydrates, proteins and fats. In R.E we have been learning about Rosh Hashanah.

Class 5

This week, in literacy, Class 5 have been completing their study of 'How to be a Lion'. The children have created some excellent illustrations of the characters in the book and have done some wonderful book reviews. In maths we are working hard on learning the three and six times tables. We have also been developing our knowledge of adding and subtracting I, IO and IOO from a number. In science we have been studying human and animal skeletons. In computing the children have been studying E-safety and have created some very imaginative posters.
