### News & Events

Welcome back and I hope you had a lovely half term break. As the weather is hopefully improving the children will be spending longer periods of time outside. ### What have we been learning this week?

### Nursery

In Nursery this half term, we are learning all about Space. This week we have started to learn the names of all the different planets and have been investigating planet Earth. We enjoyed experimenting with a globe and making our own maps, we used green to represent the land and blue for the ocean. We have sorted 3D shapes to find spheres like the Earth. We played with spinning hoops and discussed how Earth spins and travels through space. We have enjoyed playing with small world rockets, astronauts and space themed playdough mats. We enjoyed following a recipe to make moon dough. We collected and named the ingredients, listened to the noises the baking powder made as added water and described what the dough looked like as we added black gel and silver glitter. Our new vocabulary this week has included 'astronaut', 'asteroid', 'planets' and 'space shuttle'.

We have had sessions with Tracy and Rhiannon. On Thursday morning we returned our books to the library and selected new space themed story books for our reading area. We have enjoyed playing in the nursery garden and on the bikes and scooters.

Next week, our focus will be 'The Sun'.




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
### Class I

In class this week we have begun to explore the story 'Billy's Bucket'. The children have been excited to see our caterpillars transform into butterflies. We released 4 butterflies this week. New vocabulary; egg, chrysalis, hatch, water cycle.



### <u>Class 2 & 3</u>

Year I and 2 have been very busy this week reviewing their set 2 sounds in phonics and using 'Fred Talk' to read and write set 3 words. The children have practised pinching their sounds on their fingers and using this knowledge to spell words correctly. In PSHE the children have started looking at how they grow from a baby to an adult and how their body and feelings change as this happens. In science they have looked at the 7 life processes to identify if something is alive, dead, or has never been alive. This week the children have had fun on the field playing cricket in PE, they have practised bowling the ball at wickets and looked at overarm and underarm throws to pass the ball. A super week back after half term!






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This week in literacy we have been introduced to our new book called 'The Pebble In My Pocket. It tells the story of the journey of a stone. In the book we looked at the illustrations of volcanoes, dinosaurs and the early humans that walked the earth. We used our knowledge and understanding of the story to help us answer questions.


Class 4

In history we have been looking at Anglo Saxon runes. We have been using the Anglo Saxon alphabet to write our name, school name and to create a secret message to our friend to translate.



### Class 5 & 6

This week, Year 4 have started a new book called 'Pebble in my Pocket' which charts the history of our planet from a geological perspective. It's quite a demanding book but contains lots of exciting information and illustrations about volcanoes and dinosaurs amongst other things. In maths we have been learning about angles and symmetry and working hard on learning our tables. We have played rugby and football rounders this week and it is great to see the children's throwing, catching and team skills developing. Next week those children going to Tweedmouth Middle School will be going on their first transition visit.
