Class 4

This week in literacy class 4 have been reading a new book called 'The Boy with Flowers in His Hair'. The book is all about being kind and helpful to others. We have begun to develop an information booklet all about flowers. We will be adding key elements such as: facts of common flowers, exotic flowers and dangerous flowers alongside illustrations. In numeracy we have developed our ability to tell the time. We have looked at analogue and digital clocks and have used key vocabulary such as: quarter to, quarter past and half past when reading the time. This week is creative week and we have been creating self portraits based on the style of Frida Kahlo. We used a black canvas to help the colours jump out of the page. In P.E we have been developing our rugby skills and have started playing tag rugby. We focused on using our agility to beat defenders.



Class 5 & 6

Year 4 have had a great time this week. On Monday 17 pupils went to the Year 4 Cricket Festival at Berwick Middle School. As part of Creative week we have been reading 'The Boy with Flowers in His Hair'. We have been looking at the paintings of Frida Kahlo and have used them to help us draw our own self-portraits. We have also used oil pastels to draw large flowers that were inspired by the work of Georgia O'Keeffe. On Friday we practised for Sports Day and are all really looking forward to competing next week!
