They also enjoyed making pizza dough and carefully chopping their own healthy toppings. In science, the children have continued to learn about the different parts of a flower. For our literacy work, the children described the setting of our story 'The Bee that Spoke.'

Year 2 have been very busy this week designing and making their own Jubilee bunting. The children made templates to cut their designs out of felt and have sewn their bunting together using a running stitch. The children cannot wait to share the finished bunting with you next week when it is all put together. As a treat this week Year 2 had a special Yoga Session where they partici-

pated in relaxation exercises and enjoyed fun games.









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Class 4

This week in literacy class 4 have been working on an illustration to go alongside a first hand experience of walking through our very own jungle. In numeracy we have been working on money word problems, trying to figure out which method to use whether it is subtraction, addition or multiplication. In science we have been using scientific keys to group different animals and used this knowledge to help us group animals we may have seen at The Hlrsel. Once we had finished, we looked at some new photographs capturing the female farmers' within Northern England. Our key
