School News

We are now officially Spittal Community Primary School as we move on to the next part of the partnership reorganisation. Most internal renovations are complete with new signage to be installed in the coming weeks.

Attached is a paper copy of dates for the school year. Staff are in the process of booking trips to give as much advance notice as possible. This will include a residential for Year 5. Additional dates will be added as time goes by and these dates are confirmed via parent app and in our weekly newsletter. The website also contains other useful information such as term dates, the school prospectus, curriculum information and photographs.

Please remember to send any money into school in a named envelope on a Monday. Swimming this term is for children in Year 5 and will commence next week. We ask for a contribution of £3.00 per week payable on a Monday. If you would like to pay in advance the cost for this half term's swimming is £21.00. If you would like to pay in advance for school meals the cost is £2.50 per day/£12.50 per week. This is payable in cash or online through School Grid. P.E and swimming will both start next week so please ensure children come to school dressed in their PE kits on their designated days as follows;

Monday-Year 4

Wednesday- Whole school

Thursday- Year 1,2,3 and 5

Friday- Reception and Year 4 (swimming)

Details to follow regarding an after-school PE club beginning next week for children in Year 3, 4 and 5 who would like to attend. Our new school PE uniform of white T-shirt, hooded sweatshirt, black shorts or joggers and trainers should only be worn on PE days and for trips. Please could you ensure that children only wear plain small stud earrings. At the end of the school day, class teachers dismiss children one at a time to ensure the safety of the children. This may take time, but we thank you for your patience. If there is a change to the person who is picking your child up, please inform the class teacher.

Free School Meals and School Milk

School meals are free for those in reception, year one and two but need to be paid for from year three onwards unless you are eligible for Means Tested Free School Meals. However, to receive free school milk from the term after your child's fifth birthday parents will still need to apply for Free School Meals. The school also receives funding for each child from families receiving these benefits if Free School Meals are applied for.

This funding is used to provide extra support for children to help them to achieve their very best at school. Please apply for Free School Meals if at any time you become eligible for any of the benefits listed even if your child is in reception, year one or two. Forms are available from the school office.

Children are eligible for Free School Meals if any of the following are met;

- Universal credit (provided your annual net earned income is not more than £7400 from your last 3 assessment periods.)
- Child Tax Credit ONLY- Income below £16,190 (Families receiving Working Tax Credit are not eligible)
- Income Support
- Income Related Employment and Support Allowance.
- Income Based Job Seekers allowance
- Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit.
- The Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
